

SLO MakerSpace FAQs

Q: What is SLO MakerSpace?

A: It is an open, collaborative machine/wood/electronics shop and craft center where one can build projects, teach and take classes, and network with others interested in making things. Q: Where is the MakerSpace?

A: The MakerSpace is located in the retail center at the intersection of Higuera St and Madonna Rd, 81 Higuera St, Suites 160 + 180. The MakerSpace is in the Northeast corner of the complex.

Q: What equipment does SLO MakerSpace provide?

A: SLO MakerSpace is equipped with a wide range of woodworking and metalworking tools, a pottery studio, electronics lab, 3D printer, and more. For a complete list of equipment please visit the SLO MakerSpace Facility website. Note: All Library card holders must take our free Basic Safety Course prior to using the MakerSpace and some advanced equipment require a certification class provided by the MakerSpace at an additional expense.

Q: Are materials provided?

A: The MakerSpace does not supply raw materials (i.e. wood, metal, clay, 3D printer filament), you will need to supply your own.

How it works:



- ◆ One entry per person

- ◆ There are three age categories: children 12 and under, teens, and adults
- ◆ The title of the book, poem or nursery rhyme you are portraying needs to show in your diorama
- ◆ Write your name, age and contact number on the bottom



Visitors to the library will vote for their favorite, by age category, and the diorama that receives the most votes, wins! **Voting will take place the week of March 21-25** and awards given Saturday March 26. (Prizes may be different at each library)


